Catch Up Funding

After the partial closure of schools during the lockdown from March 2020 to June 2020, the DfE allocated additional funding for schools to enable children to 'catch up' and to provide pastoral support for social and emotional well-being.

Over a two year period, it is expected that Moorside's allocation will be approximately £45,000, with the money being split across two financial years. Therefore, only part of this money has been received so far.
