We have made it to the end of the year, with almost everyone here. Sadly we don't have 1PG and some individual children self-isolating. We look forward to welcoming them back in September. In the case of the two Y6 children not with us, we wish them well and would like them to know that they are welcome to visit and that we wish them the best of luck.

The Start of Next Year

Throughout the pandemic, a key strategy has been to have a staggered start to reduce the amount of mixing at very busy times. It is very hard to predict what conditions will be like in six weeks time, or to anticipate what government guidance will be. For the first two days, we plan to keep the staggered start in place; this is to help us manage the children as they move to unfamiliar parts of the school.

Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd September

Y1, Y3 and Y6 can arrive from 8.40 and will be asked to line up at 8.50 and their new teacher will take them to their new class.

Y2, Y4, and Y5 can arrive from 8.50 and will be asked to line up 9.00 and their new teacher will take them to their new class.

Monday 6th September Onwards

The official start of the school day will revert to our normal time of 8.50am.

Years 2 to 6 may arrive on the playground from 8.40 and go into the building when they are ready, but they must be in by 8.50.

Y1 may also arrive on the playground from 8.40, but will continue to line up until the teachers think the children are confident and ready to make their way down to their classrooms themselves.

Initially, until there is a clear view of case rates and transmission, we are still trying to minimise the numbers on the school site at at any one time. However, we understand that Y1-3 parents will still want to come onto the playground and wait until their child has gone into the building.

One way systems will remain in place initially and we would ask that parents wear masks on the school site and definitely wear them if talking to a teacher. As the picture becomes clearer in September, we hope to be able to review and remove these measures.

Buddy Bench

The Buddy Bench is now complete and has become really popular during the day and before and after school. It's plaque has been fitted in memory of Lottie, a former pupil. If you are passing the bench or take time to sit on it, please read the plaque as it will make you smile, giving a positive message for how to live your life ('enjoy life, laugh a lot and eat cake'). Educational visits are a big part of life at Moorside. Looking ahead to next year, current Y4 parents have been be aware that we are planning on taking the new Y5 children to York for a two night residential in November, letters went home yesterday. Current Y5 parents need to be aware that we are planning on taking the new Y6 children to Hawse End in the Lake District in March 2021. Again, more details will be shared in September. We apologise to the current Y5 parents as we are aware that you have only just paid for your child to go to York, but in normal times, there is an eighteen month gap between these visits and time to save up, but the pandemic has meant that this year visit to York was delayed and took place in June and July.

Uniform

The last two years have been disrupted and we understand that at times, some aspects of uniform have not been readily available or that it has not been cost effective to buy new footwear just before a long holiday. The vast majority of children are well-turned out and smart. Please may we remind all parents that it is an expectation that all children wear full uniform everyday and that children should have school shoes and NOT trainers. We want all children to be smart and appropriately dressed. It is also an issue of fairness that the expectation and access to school clothing is the same for all children. We don't want children to have the distraction of worrying about the brand of trainers they have. Other reminders about uniform include:

- -socks should be grey, black or white and free from embellishments
- -earrings should be simple and small and not liable to catching on clothing

- -long hair should be tied back and, if head bands are worn, they should also be simple and plain
- -our PE kit is white T-shirt and black or blue shorts, with trainers / pumps for indoor use by KS1 children
- -skirts should be of a suitable length for primary school-aged children
- -no makeup at all should be worn
- -please consider the style of school shoes that you send your child in, remembering that they spend their playtimes running around, often on uneven ground, and some of the strappy or loose -fitting ones on the market are not fit for purpose

Additional Holiday

Next year, as a result of the Queen's Jubilee, there is an additional bank holiday. Schools have been given discretion when to take it. Our proposed date is Monday 6th June ie the day after the summer half-term. This will be confirmed in the the autumn.
